BACKGROUND



- Destination BC is monitoring British Columbian's current views on travel and tourism as well as tracking travel and tourism behaviour intentions in order to understand the impact of COVID-19 on the tourism industry.
- As such, Destination BC has commissioned Insights West to conduct a number of waves of research, one every two weeks, starting May 13, 2020 to track opinions and intentions and watch how results trend over time.

METHODOLOGY

- Online survey with ~800 British Columbian adults via an omnibus (shared study).
- Data is weighted by age, gender, region within BC and past voting behaviour to ensure it is representative of the province.

SUMMARY



TRAVEL INTENTIONS

- **BC** residents' intentions to travel within their surrounding area for a day trip, in the next 4 weeks, continues to be greatest (38%), compared to intentions to travel to other areas, such as to other parts of the province for an overnight trip (17%), to other provinces within Canada (5%), to the US (2%), or to other countries (2%).
- Compared to Wave 11, BC residents' intentions to travel within BC in the next 4 weeks has decreased considerably. Intentions to travel within the surrounding area for a day trip in the next 4 weeks decreased to 38% from 55% in Wave 11. Intentions to travel to other parts of the province for an overnight trip decreased as well (17% in Wave 12 from 29% in Wave 11). This is likely due, in part, to typical declines in travel during the Fall season. However, intentions to travel within BC in the next 12 months has also declined (70% vs. 81% in Wave 11).
- While intentions to travel to other parts of Canada, the US, and other countries remained unchanged for the next 4 weeks, intentions to travel to other parts of Canada and the US have decreased when looking ahead to the next 12 months (other parts of Canada: 70% in Wave 12 from 81% in Wave 11; US: 17% in Wave 12 from 21% in Wave 11).
- For the first time since mid-July, the percentage of BC residents who report they would only travel if a vaccine / treatment is available has increased to 6% (up from 3% in Wave 11) for travel to nearby communities, 16% (up from 10%) for travel to other provinces, and 38% (up from 33%) for travel to the US.

CONCERN TO WELCOME VISITORS

- **BC** residents' concerns of welcoming visitors into their community has increased compared to Wave 11. Forty-three percent of BC residents are concerned with welcoming visitors into their community from surrounding areas (up from 32% in Wave 11), 54% are concerned with welcoming visitors from other parts of the province (up from 45%), and 80% from other parts of Canada (up from 76%).
- BC residents' concerns of welcoming visitors from the US (91%) and from other countries (93%) have remained unchanged.
- BC residents who are 18-34 years of age have greater concerns with welcoming visitors from nearby communities, elsewhere from BC or from other parts of Canada, compared to other age groups (35-54 years and 55+ years.
- Within Canada, BC residents are 'very concerned' with welcoming visitors from Quebec (60%) and Ontario (57%); the level of concern has increased since Wave 11, 57% and 51%, respectively.

COMFORT WITH ACTIVITIES/MODES OF TRANSPORTATION

- Albeit to varying degrees, levels of comfort to participate in all tourism-related activities tracked in this study have decreased since Wave 11. Similar to BC residents' intentions to travel, their decreased comfort to participate in tourism-related activities over the next few weeks is likely, in part, due to the typical decline seen in the Fall season.
- Level of comfort to travel by plane (19%) or take a cruise (13%) in the coming weeks by BC residents remains low.
- Likelihood to travel by car/RV for non-essential travel and ferry has declined from Wave 11 (down -9% and -6%, respectively).





































(Canadian Visitors)







(Among Those Who Generally Do Each)






