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BACKGROUND



- Destination BC is monitoring British Columbian's current views on travel and tourism as well as tracking travel and tourism behaviour intentions in order to understand the impact of COVID-19 on the tourism industry.
- As such, Destination BC has commissioned Insights West to conduct a number of waves of research, one every two weeks, starting May 13, 2020 to track opinions and intentions and watch how results trend over time.

METHODOLOGY

- Online survey with at least 800 British Columbian adults via an omnibus (shared study).
- Data is weighted by age, gender, region within BC and past voting behaviour to ensure it is representative of the province.

SUMMARY



TRAVEL INTENTIONS

- BC residents' intentions to travel within their surrounding area for a day trip, in the next 4 weeks, continues to be greatest (43%) compared to intentions to travel to other areas for an overnight trip, such as to other parts of the province (13%), to other provinces within Canada (4%), to the US (2%), or to other countries (1%).
- While BC residents' intentions to travel in the next 4 weeks has increased from 38% to 43% for surrounding areas for a day trip, overall intentions to take a day trip have slowly declined since the height of intentions reported in August (65%). BC residents' intentions to travel in the next 4 weeks, as reported in Wave 13, are now similar to BC residents' intentions captured in May.
- BC residents' intentions to travel to other parts of Canada, the US and other countries in the next 4 weeks remain unchanged in Wave 13, compared to Wave 12.
- Likelihood of travelling to the US or to other countries without a vaccine/treatment available continues to be low and unchanged from the increase seen in Wave 12 (the first increase since mid-July).
- In Wave 13, BC residents who indicated short-term intentions to travel (next 4 weeks) within BC are more likely to have a household income of \$75k+ and are residents from Vancouver Island or 'Rest of BC'.

SUMMARY (cont.)



CONCERN TO WELCOME VISITORS

- For two consecutive waves, the level of concern to welcome visitors from BC increased BC residents are more concerned to welcome visitors into their community compared to previous waves. Forty-seven percent of BC residents are concerned with welcoming visitors into their community from surrounding areas (up from 43% in Wave 12). This is the second greatest level of concern reported through the tracking waves; the greatest level of concern was reported in Wave 1, May 13.
- Concern to welcome visitors from other parts of Canada, the US and other countries remain unchanged.
- BC residents who are 55 years+ and have a household income of under \$75K have greater concerns with welcoming visitors from nearby communities or elsewhere in BC. Residents from Vancouver Island are more concerned to welcome visitors from elsewhere in BC, compared to Metro Vancouver residents and 'Rest of BC' residents.
- Within Canada, BC residents are most concerned with welcoming visitors from Quebec (87%) and Ontario (86%) and levels of concern have remained unchanged from those reported in Wave 12. Concern to welcome visitors from all provinces and territories has remained unchanged from Wave 12, except for concerns to welcome visitors from Manitoba/Saskatchewan (up to 70% from 64% in Wave 12).

COMFORT WITH ACTIVITIES/MODES OF TRANSPORTATION

- With the exception of eating in a restaurant, where comfort to particulate increased (up to 68% from 64% in Wave 12), levels of comfort to participate in all other tourism-related activities remain unchanged in Wave 13.
- Level of comfort to travel by plane (23%) or take a cruise (17%) in the coming weeks by BC residents remains low, however, levels have increased from Wave 12 (up from 19% and 13%, respectively). Comfort to travel by car/RV for non-essential travel remains unchanged from Wave 12 (70% vs. 71% in Wave 12).

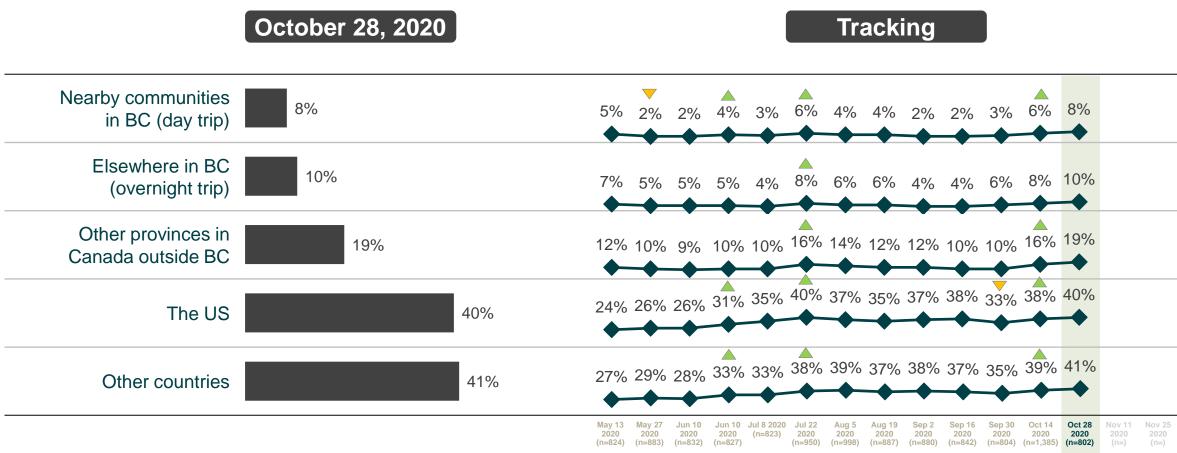

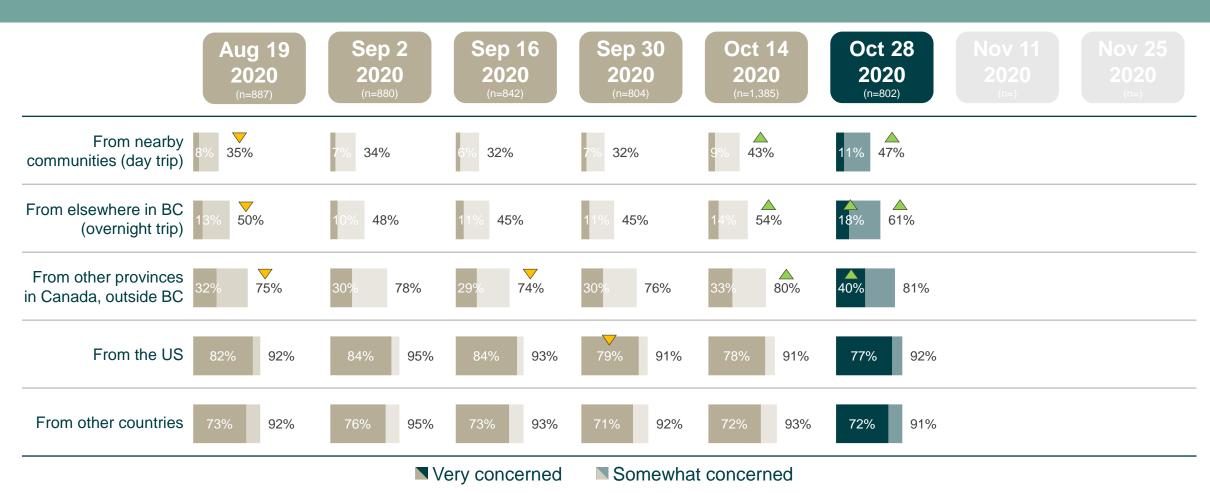

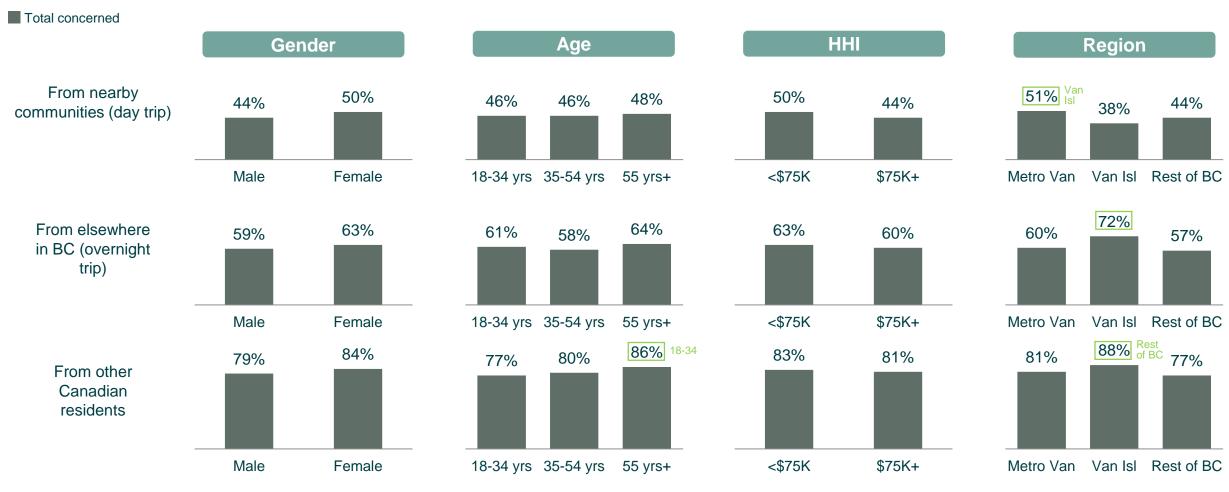

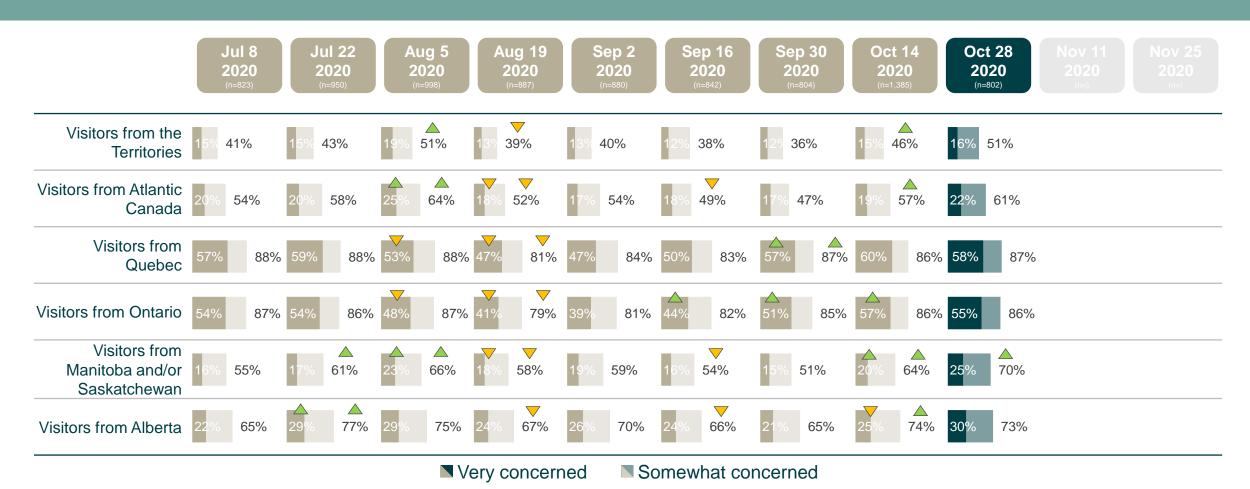

(Canadian Visitors)





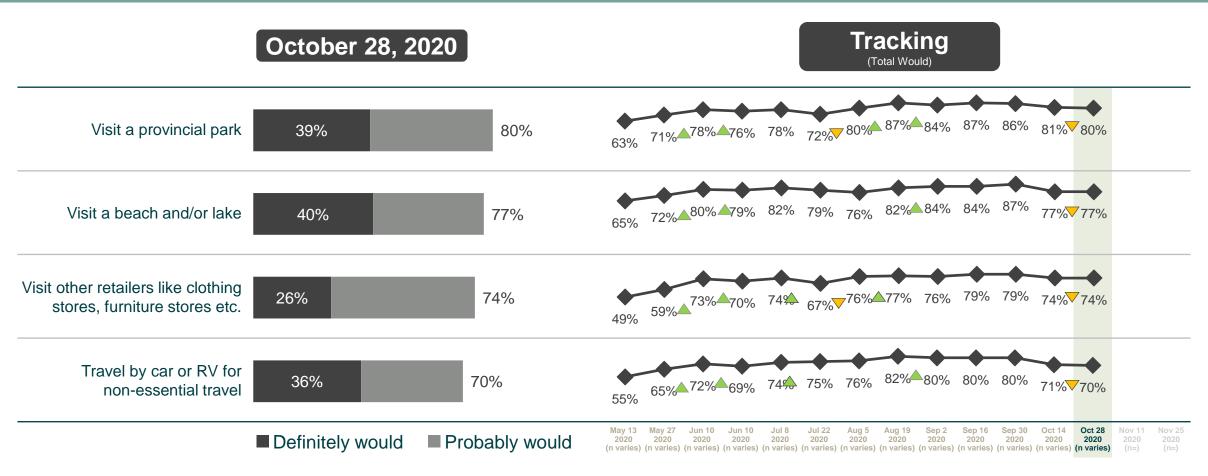

(Among Those Who Generally Do Each)



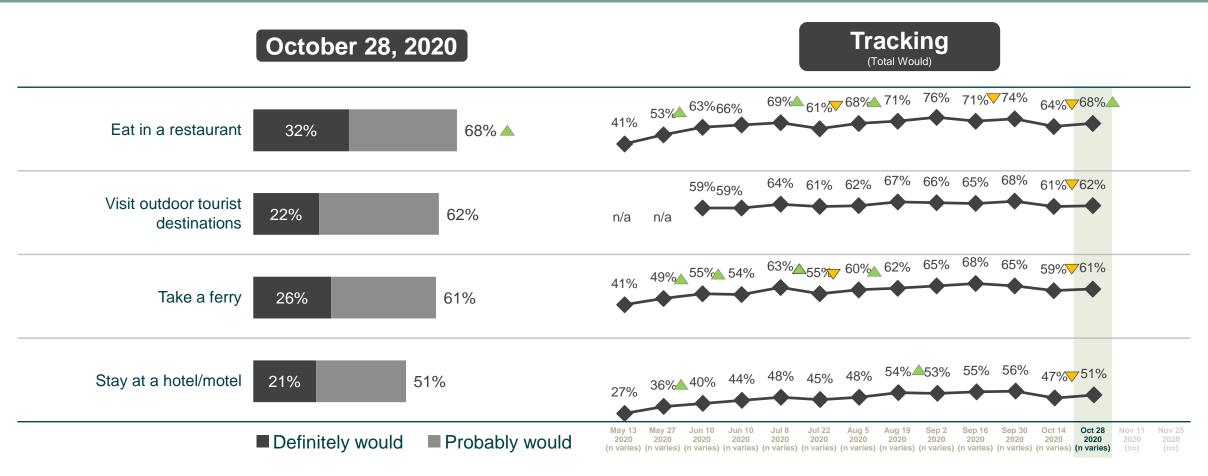

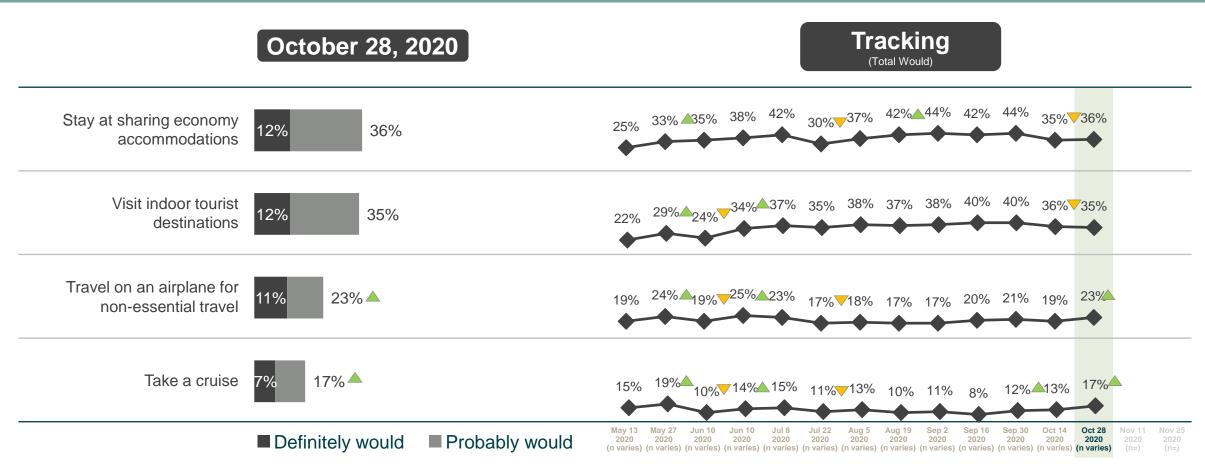
