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BACKGROUND



- Destination BC is monitoring British Columbian's current views on travel and tourism as well as tracking travel and tourism behaviour intentions in order to understand the impact of COVID-19 on the tourism industry.
- As such, Destination BC has commissioned Insights West to conduct a number of waves of research, one every two weeks, starting May 13, 2020 to track opinions and intentions and watch how results trend over time.
- Note that some changes and additions were made to the questions in a couple of waves to continue to fully meet the research needs of the project.

METHODOLOGY

- Online survey with at least 800 British Columbian adults via an omnibus (shared study).
- Data is weighted by age, gender, region within BC and past voting behaviour to ensure it is representative of the province.

SUMMARY



PAST TRAVEL

- As expected, BC residents took more leisure trips within the province year-to-date (January October) compared to taking trips elsewhere.
- During January March, BC residents travelled most within the province (31% took at least 1 leisure trip), followed by travel to the US (16%) and to other countries (9%).
- In recent months (July September), BC residents increased the total number of trips taken within the province (44% took at least 1 leisure trip), followed by trips to other provinces within Canada, albeit at a much lower rate (9%). Trips to the US and to other countries taken by BC residents essentially came to a halt in April.

TRAVEL INTENTIONS

- BC residents' intentions to travel within their surrounding area for a day trip, in the next 4 weeks, continues to be greatest (35%) compared to intentions to travel to other areas for an overnight trip, such as to other parts of the province (11%), to other provinces within Canada (2%), to the US (1%), or to other countries (0%).
- BC residents' intentions to travel to surrounding areas for a day trip in the next 4 weeks has decreased from 43% to 35%, however BC residents' intentions to travel in the next 2-3 months has increased from Wave 13 (24% from 17%).
- BC residents' intentions to travel to surround areas for a day trip in the next 4 weeks, as reported in Wave 14, are the lowest they have been since May, when we started tracking BC residents' intentions.
- BC residents' intentions to travel to other parts of the province, to other parts of Canada, the US and other countries in the next 4 weeks remain unchanged in Wave 14, compared to Wave 13, however, overall intentions to travel in the next 12 months has decreased for travel to other parts of Canada (39% from 43% in Wave 13) and to other countries (14% from 18%).
- Likelihood of travelling to the US or to other countries without a vaccine/treatment available continues to be low and unchanged.
- In Wave 14, BC residents who indicated short-term intentions to travel (next 4 weeks) within BC are more likely to have a household income of \$75k+ and are residents from Vancouver Island.

SUMMARY (cont.)



REASONS FOR NOT CONSIDERING TRAVEL

BC residents who indicated they did not intend to travel in the next 3 months at the time of Wave 14, or until a vaccine/treatment is available, were asked why they were not likely to travel. 65% of BC residents indicated that they do not intend to travel because of the 'risk of being exposed/contracting COVID-19', followed by 54% of BC residents who indicated 'concerns that COVID-19 protocols are not being properly followed'.

COMFORT WITH ACTIVITIES/MODES OF TRANSPORTATION

- With the exception of visiting a provincial park or visiting a beach/lake, where comfort to participate remain unchanged (78% and 76%, respectively, in Wave 14), levels of comfort to participate in all other tourism-related activities have decreased in Wave 14.
- Level of comfort to travel by plane (17%) or take a cruise (13%) in the coming weeks by BC residents remains low, and have decreased from Wave 13 (down from 23% and 17%, respectively). Comfort to travel by car/RV for non-essential travel has also decreased from Wave 13 (60% vs. 70% in Wave 13).

SUMMARY (cont.)



CONCERN TO WELCOME VISITORS

- BC residents' level of concern to welcome visitors into their community from nearby communities remains stable after two
 consecutive waves of increased concerns.
- Concern to welcome visitors from other parts of the province, other parts of Canada, the US and other countries also remains unchanged from Wave 13.
- Within Canada, BC residents are most concerned with welcoming visitors from Quebec and Ontario (88%) (levels of concern have remained unchanged from Wave 13). This is followed by visitors visiting from Alberta (81%) and Manitoba/Saskatchewan (80%), up from 70% and 73%, respectively, from Wave 13.











Concern to Welcome Visitors by Demographics









(Canadian Visitors)










