BACKGROUND



- Destination BC is monitoring British Columbian's current views on travel and tourism as well as tracking travel and tourism behaviour intentions in order to understand the impact of COVID-19 on the tourism industry.
- As such, Destination BC has commissioned Insights West to conduct a number of waves of research, one every two weeks, starting May 13, 2020 to track opinions and intentions and watch how results trend over time.
- Note that some changes and additions were made to the questions in a couple of waves to continue to fully meet the research needs of the project.

METHODOLOGY

- Online survey with at least 800 British Columbian adults via an omnibus (shared study).
- Data is weighted by age, gender, region and past voting behaviour to ensure it is representative of the province.

SUMMARY



PAST TRAVEL

- In Wave 14, November 12, BC residents were asked about their past travel in 2020. The number of trips were gathered for the January-March period, April-June period, and July-September period. In January 2021, BC residents will be asked about their trips taken between October-December 2020.
- As expected, it was found that BC residents took more leisure trips within the province year-to-date (January October) compared to taking trips elsewhere, such as to other parts of Canada, the US, or other countries.
- During January March, BC residents travelled most within the province (31% took at least 1 leisure trip), followed by travel to the US (16%), and to other countries (9%).
- In recent months (July September), BC residents increased the total number of trips taken within the province (44% took at least 1 leisure trip), followed by trips to other provinces within Canada, albeit at a much lower rate (9%). Trips to the US and to other countries taken by BC residents essentially came to a halt in April.

TRAVEL INTENTIONS

- In Wave 16, December 9, **BC** residents' intentions to travel within their surrounding area for a day trip, in the next 4 weeks, continues to be greatest (38%) compared to intentions to travel to other areas for an overnight trip, such as to other parts of the province (9%), to other provinces within Canada (3%), to the US (2%), or to other countries (1%).
- BC residents' intentions to travel to surrounding areas for a day trip in the next 4 weeks has increased from 31% to 38% in Wave 16.
- BC residents' intentions to travel in the next 12 months have increased as well. BC residents' intentions to travel within their surrounding area for a day trip (86%, up from 80% in Wave 15), to other parts of the province (74%, up from 67%) or to other parts of Canada (45%, up from 41%) have increased from Wave 15.
- Likelihood of travelling to the US or to other countries without a vaccine/treatment available continues to be low, representing a third of BC resident respondents who do not intend to travel without a vaccine/treatment, however, fewer people indicated that a vaccine/treatment would be needed in Wave 16, compared to 15. This decrease was seen not only when thinking about travelling to the US and other countries, but also within BC and to other parts of Canada.
- In Wave 16, no differences are seen by age, gender, household income, or where one resides within BC, by BC residents who indicated short-term intentions to travel (next 4 weeks) within BC.

SUMMARY (cont.)



REASONS FOR NOT CONSIDERING TRAVEL

- In Wave 14, November 12, BC residents who did not intend to travel in the next 3 months at the time of Wave 14 or until a vaccine/treatment is available were asked why they were not likely to travel. This question will not be asked on a regular basis.
- BC residents who indicated they did not intend to travel in the next 3 months at the time of Wave 14 or until a vaccine/treatment is available, were asked why they did not intend to travel. 65% of BC residents indicated that they do not intend to travel because of the 'risk of being exposed/contracting COVID-19' and 54% of BC residents indicated they do not intend to travel because of 'concerns that COVID-19 protocols are not being properly followed'.

CONCERN TO WELCOME VISITORS

- BC residents' level of concern to welcome visitors into their community from nearby communities remain higher than they
 have been since the beginning of tracking, however, a decrease from Wave 15 was seen (61% in Wave 15 to 54% in Wave 16).
- Concern to welcome visitors from other parts of the province, other parts of Canada, the US, and other countries remains unchanged from Wave 15.

COMFORT WITH ACTIVITIES/MODES OF TRANSPORTATION


- With the exception of visiting a beach/lake or retailer stores, where comfort to visit increased (73%, up from 69% in Wave 15 and 70%, up from 66% in Wave 15, respectively), levels of comfort to participate in all other tourism-related activities have remained unchanged from Wave 15.
- Level of comfort to travel by plane (16%) or take a cruise (12%) in the coming weeks by BC residents remains low, but has remained unchanged from Wave 15. Comfort to travel by car/RV for non-essential travel has remained unchanged as well (49%).















Aided Reasons for Not Considering BC Travel





(Wave 16 – December 9, 2020)










