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#### BACKGROUND



- Destination BC is monitoring British Columbians' current views on travel and tourism as well as tracking travel and tourism behaviour intentions in order to understand the impact of COVID-19 on the tourism industry.
- As such, Destination BC has commissioned Insights West to conduct a number of waves of research, one approximately every two weeks, starting May 13, 2020 to track opinions and intentions and watch how results trend over time.
- Note that some changes and additions were made to the questions in a couple of waves to continue to fully meet the research needs of the project.

#### **METHODOLOGY**

- Online survey with at least 800 British Columbian adults via an omnibus (shared study).
- Data is weighted by age, gender, region and past voting behaviour to ensure it is representative of the province.

### KEY HIGHLIGHTS – WHAT'S NEW OR CHANGED



#### **PAST TRAVEL**

- This wave we asked about travel for the most recent three-month time period (January through March, 2021), adding to the timeline started in 2020. Results show trips taken are as low, or lower, than at any point in the past, with decreased travel intentions likely caused by rising case numbers and increasing travel restrictions.
  - Overnight trips in BC were taken by only 18% of British Columbians in the past three months, down 7% from the three months previous, and 13% lower than at the same time last year.
  - Trips to other provinces is also at a historical low of 3%, down 2% from the last three months and 4% lower than the same time last year.
  - Trips to the US or other countries remain at nearly zero levels as they have since April 2020.

#### TRAVEL INTENTIONS

- Recent events, most notably the Provincial Health Officer's announcement of increased restrictions on March 29<sup>th</sup>, have also apparently stalled what was an emerging trend in increased travel intentions, with all types of travel intentions remaining at the same levels or declining slightly when compared with the previous wave (March 17<sup>th</sup>, 2021).
- Travel intentions have varied amongst the different demographic groups from wave to wave, which means a consistent pattern of differences has yet to emerge. However, the most consistent difference seen in the study overall persists again in Wave 23 (March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2021), and is income-based:
  - British Columbians from higher income households are more likely to be planning a trip in BC or elsewhere in Canada than lower income households (by 10% to 18% higher in the next 12 months). However, differences are fairly small in the shorter term (i.e., next 4 weeks), which may mean differences are an indicator of longer term ability to afford, instead of shorter term intentions that may be related to greater comfort in travelling during the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### **CONCERN TO WELCOME VISITORS**

- Continuing the general theme of greater concern about COVID-19, the trend in British Columbians' concerns about visitors to their community have also reversed in Wave 23 (March 31st, 2021).
  - Last wave, Wave 22 (March 17<sup>th</sup>, 2021) marked a downward trend in concern regarding local BC visitors (day trip or overnight), presumably in response to the increase in vaccines. But this wave, concern levels have come back up to the levels seen in October through December 2020, presumably marking the impact of recent rising case numbers.
  - Concern with visitors from outside the province are less changed this wave, having remained high over many waves.
  - As is consistently reported, women are more often concerned about all Canadian visitors and this wave the gaps in results
    compared with men are particularly large (concern levels are between 14% and 17% higher). Also consistent with past results,
    Vancouver Island residents remain slightly more concerned about visitors than those from other areas.
- Concern about visitors from various provinces in Canada is an alternating question and was asked this wave, after having previously been asked in Wave 20 (February 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2021).
  - Despite still being high (especially for ON, QU, MB/SK and AB), concern levels for visitors from all provinces and territories are slightly lower than in Wave 20 (February 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2021).

#### COMFORT WITH ACTIVITIES/MODES OF TRANSPORTATION


- Over the past three waves, comfort with participating in activities and modes of transportation had been slowly but surely trending upward, indicating that British Columbians were beginning to see improvements in the COVID-19 situation and expressing optimism and comfort in taking part in more usual pursuits. The recent rise in COVID-19 case numbers, however, appears to have had an impact and has reversed the trend.
- Most comfort levels have gone back down in Wave 23 (March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2021), especially those that had been increasing the most and/or were of fairly wide-spread comfort (those that only a few are comfortable doing, such as a cruise or non-essential air travel, continue at those same low levels over time).
- Specifically worth noting:
  - Dining in a restaurant is down 15% from last wave, with 49% feeling comfortable this wave; this is the lowest point to date except for the first metric in May 2020 this obviously aligns with the recent closure of restaurants by the Provincial Health Officer (PHO).
  - Shopping at non-essential retailers decreased 9% from last wave, with 69% feeling comfortable this wave similar to low levels seen in later 2020.
  - Staying a hotel or motel is down 8% this wave, with 39% feeling comfortable similar to levels seen in November 2020 through January 2021.
  - Non-essential travel by car/RV in BC is also down 8% this wave, with 52% feeling comfortable also similar to levels in November 2020 though January 2021.
  - Visiting a provincial park is down by 6% this wave, with 78% feeling comfortable similar to levels during the fall of 2020.

(Next 12 Months)











#### Concern to Welcome Visitors









# Comfort With Welcoming Visitors Under Various Circumstances (Wave 21: March 3, 2021)














