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BACKGROUND



- Destination BC is monitoring British Columbian's current views on travel and tourism as well as tracking travel and tourism behaviour intentions in order to understand the impact of COVID-19 on the tourism industry.
- As such, Destination BC has commissioned Insights West to conduct a number of waves of research, one approximately every two weeks, starting May 13, 2020 to track opinions and intentions and watch how results trend over time.
- Note that some changes and additions were made to the questions in a couple of waves to continue to fully meet the research needs of the project.

METHODOLOGY

- Online survey with at least 800 British Columbian adults via an omnibus (shared study).
- Data is weighted by age, gender, region and past voting behaviour to ensure it is representative of the province.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS – WHAT'S NEW OR CHANGED



TRAVEL INTENTIONS

- BC residents' intent to travel to nearby communities has not changed considerably from the last wave (June 10) with 67% of BC residents intending to visit nearby communities in the next 4 weeks and 84% within the next 2-3 months.
- BC residents' intent to travel for an overnight trip in BC in the next 4 weeks has increased again this wave, up +7 points to 37%, whereas BC residents' travel intentions to other parts of the province over the next 2-3 months remained relatively stable at 68%.
- There is no significant change in intention to travel to the US or other countries in either the 4-week or 2-3 month time frame reported although both continue to trend upwards.

CONCERN WELCOMING VISITORS

- The significant decreases in concern welcoming visitors from various regions seen in previous waves was not seen this wave. Concern welcoming visitors from BC, other parts of Canada, US, and other countries remaining stable from last wave (June 10).
- Measured every 2 waves, concern with welcoming visitors from specific regions in Canada shows BC residents' level of concern has decreased significantly from 4 weeks ago. Concern for welcoming Ontario visitors is down -10 points to 74%, concern for Quebec visitors is down -9 points to 74%, concern for Manitoba/Saskatchewan visitors is down -11 points to 69%, concern for Atlantic provinces visitors is down -13 points to 49%, and concern for Territories visitors is down -5 points to 42%.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS – WHAT'S NEW OR CHANGED



COMFORT WITH ACTIVITIES/MODES OF TRANSPORTATION

- BC residents' comfort levels with various activities, transportation modes and accommodation types has increased again this wave showing a steady upward trend over the last 4 waves. Currently, the largest increases tend to be for those items where comfort has been lower overall:
 - For participating in activities, this includes eating in a restaurant (up +8 points to 82%), participating in outdoor tourist activities (up +9 points to 81%), and participating in indoor tourist activities (up +9 points to 59%).
 - Comfort with all transportation modes is up, especially comfort for ferries for non-essential travel (up +17 points to 75%), but also for cruises (up +10 points to 32%), airplanes for non-essential travel (up +9 points to 39%), and cars/RVs for non-essential travel (up +9 points to 86%).
 - Comfort with both accommodation types is also up significantly again this wave, with staying at a hotel/motel up +12 points to 70% and comfort staying at a shared economy rental up +12 points to 60%.

CIRCUMSTANCES TO VISIT BC ATTRACTIONS

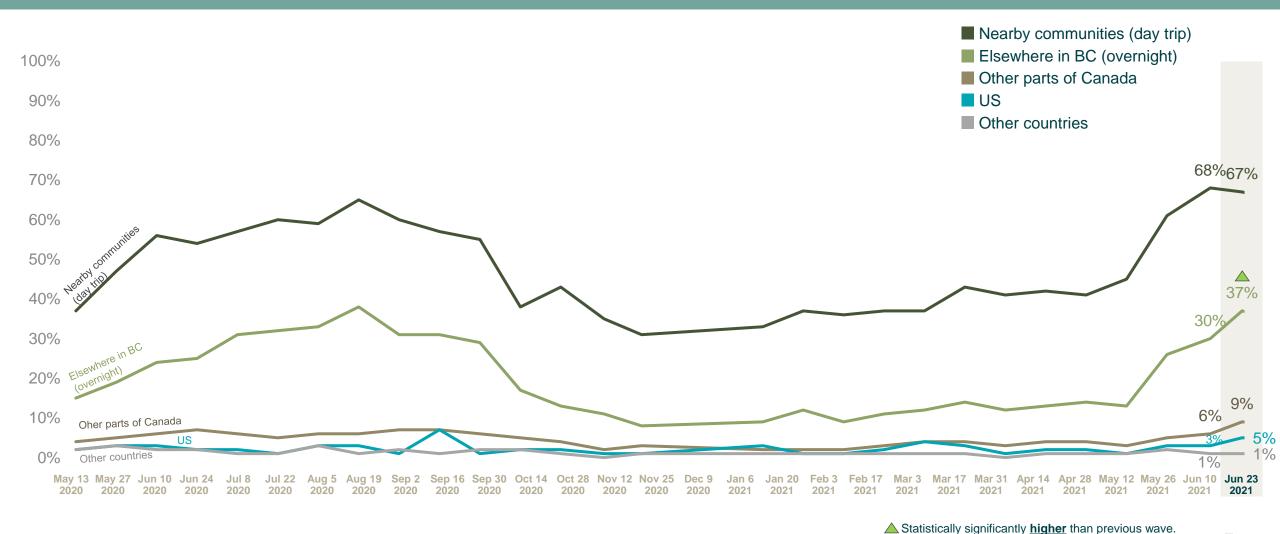
- In a new ad-hoc question this wave, 6 different health/safety protocols/conditions were tested to determine their relative importance for potential visitors considering whether to visit an indoor or outdoor attraction in BC. Respondents were allowed to choose up to 3 of these items or they could indicate that none were important, that they would not consider visiting BC attractions, or that they were not sure.
- Results are quite different for indoor versus outdoor attractions a mandatory mask policy is seen as more important for indoor attractions (49% selected it), but not seen as important for outdoor attractions (20% selected it). Additionally, having both vaccine shots is seen as more important for indoor attractions (35% selected it) than for outdoor attractions (22% selected it).

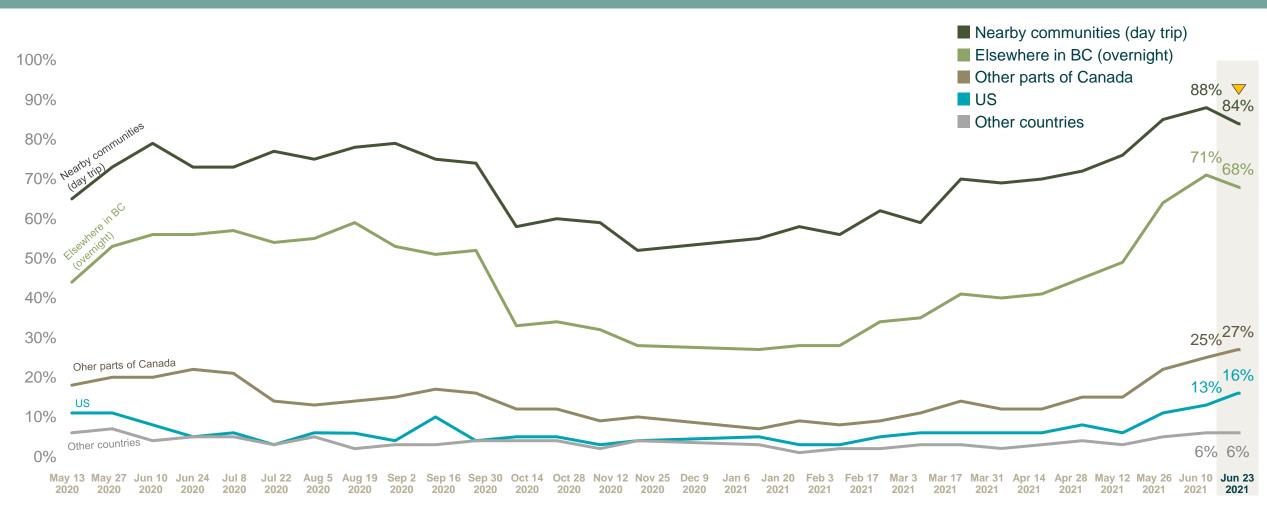
Tracking British Columbians' Travel Intent Within Next 4 Weeks (By Destination)





Tracking British Columbians' Travel Intent Within Next 2-3 Months (By Destination)





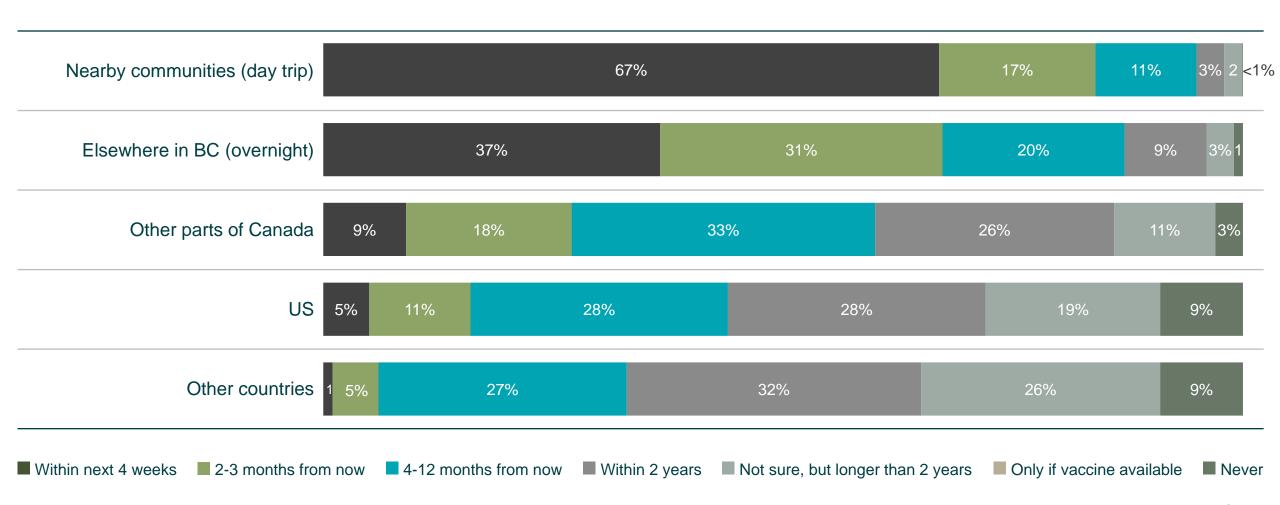

Snapshot Of British Columbians' Travel Intentions



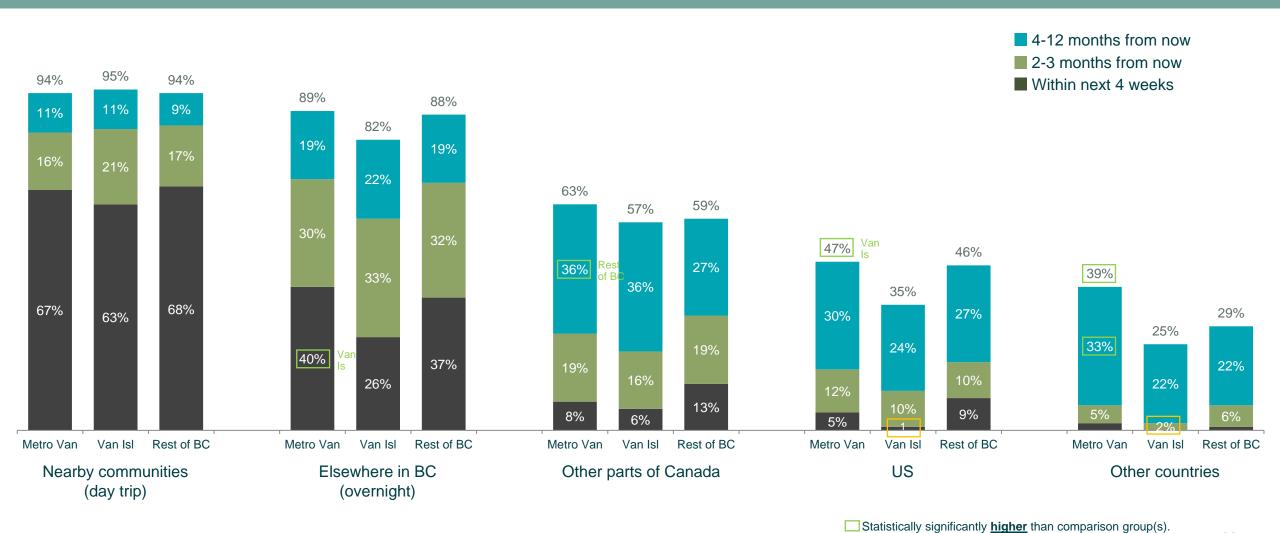

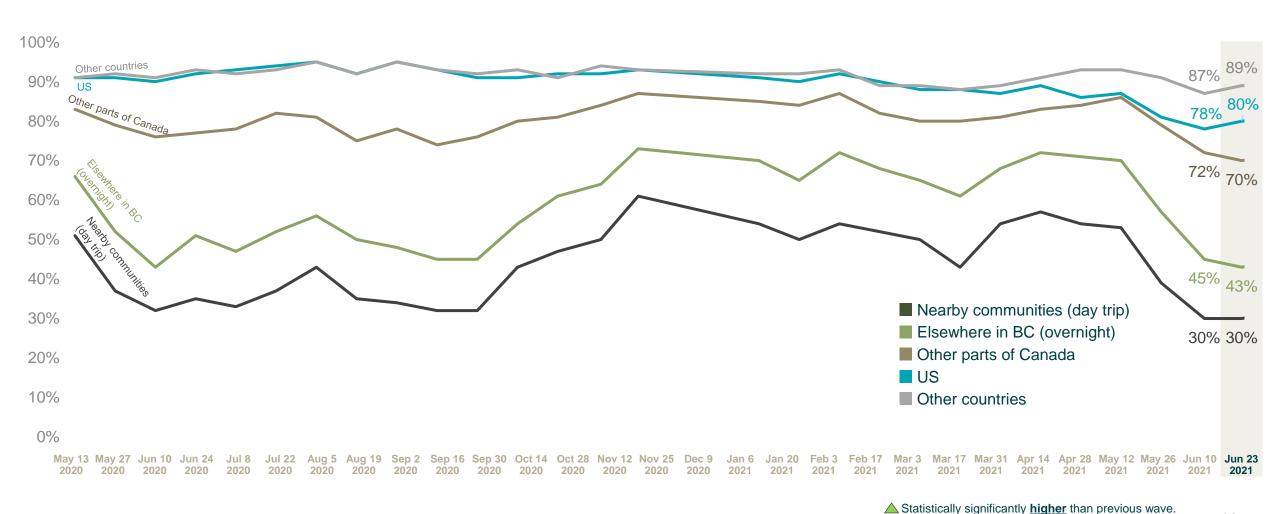

Tracking British Columbians' Concern Welcoming Visitors



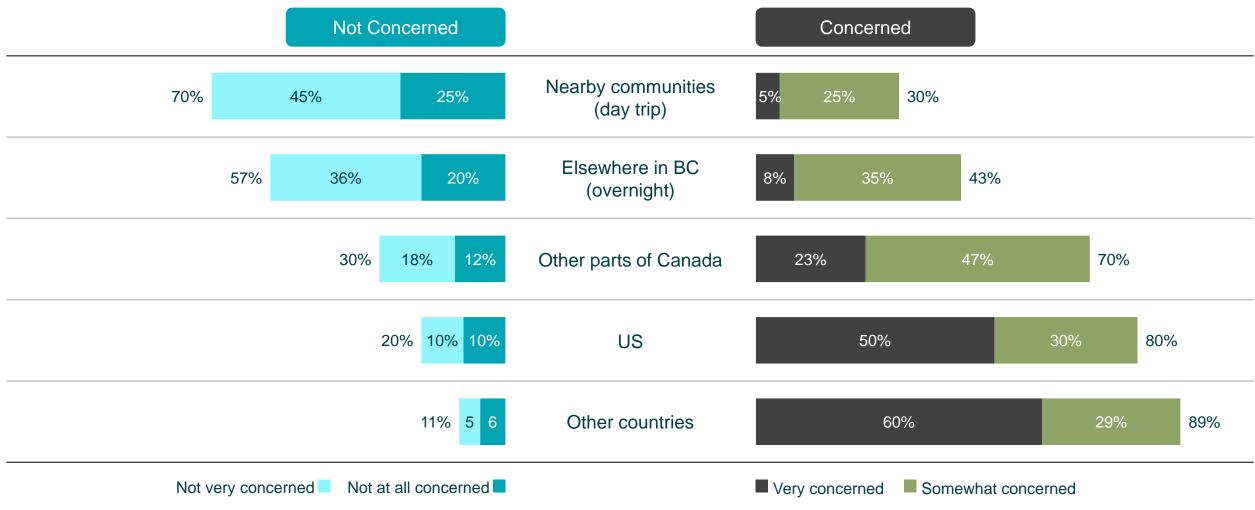

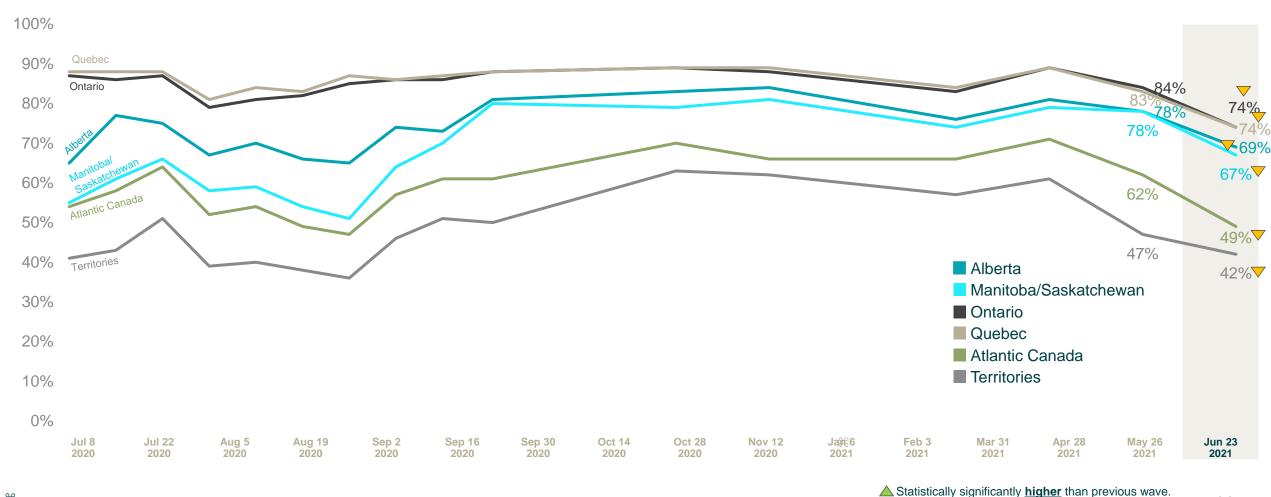

(Total Very/Somewhat Concerned By Origin)



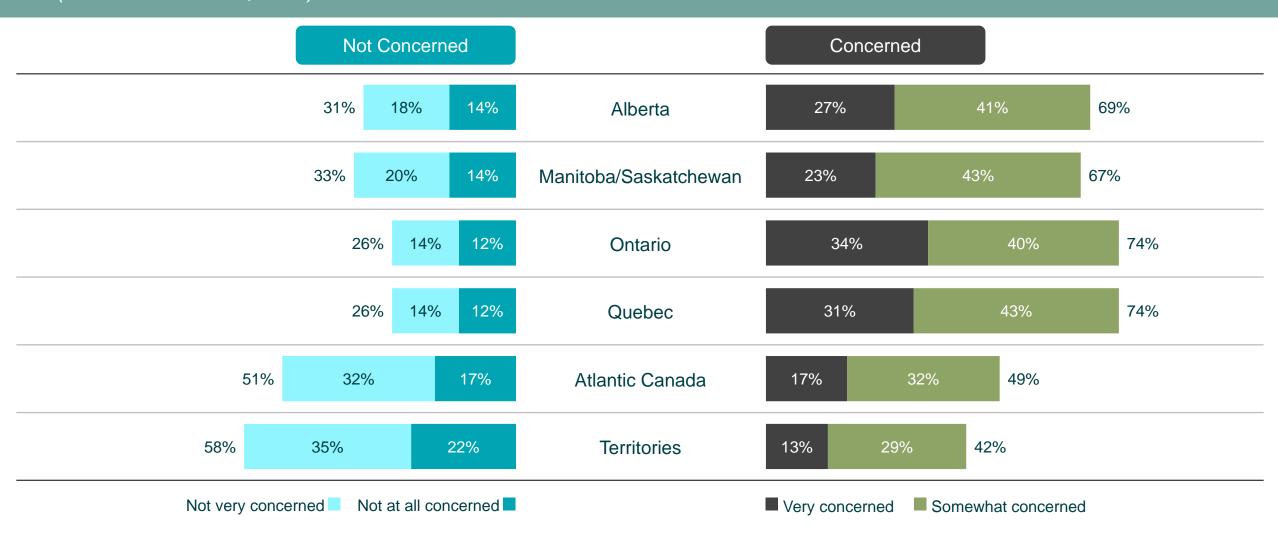

Snapshot Of British Columbians' Concern Welcoming Canadian Visitors



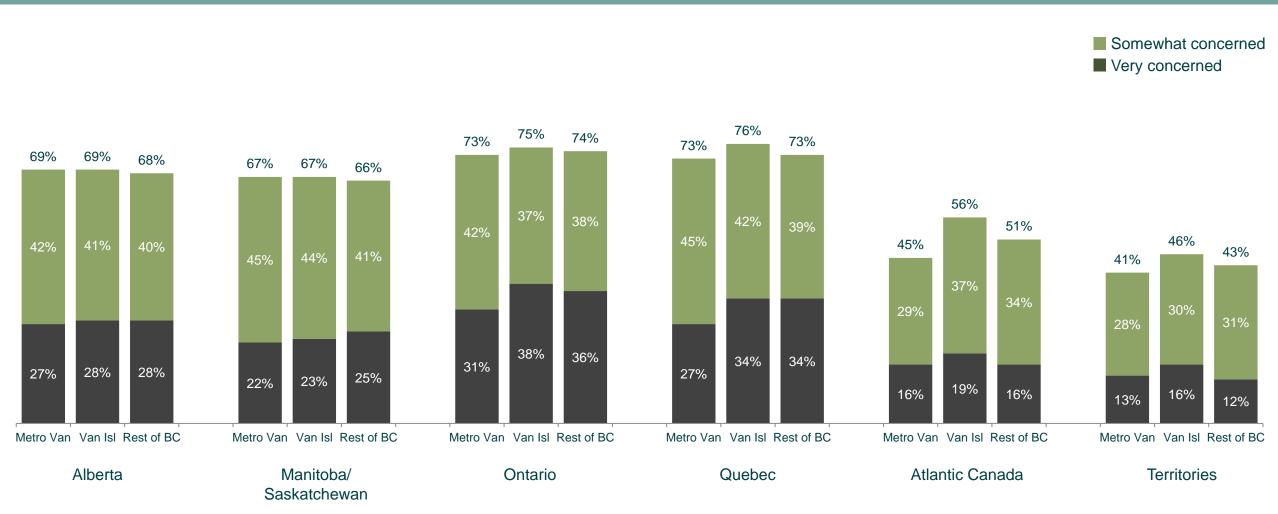

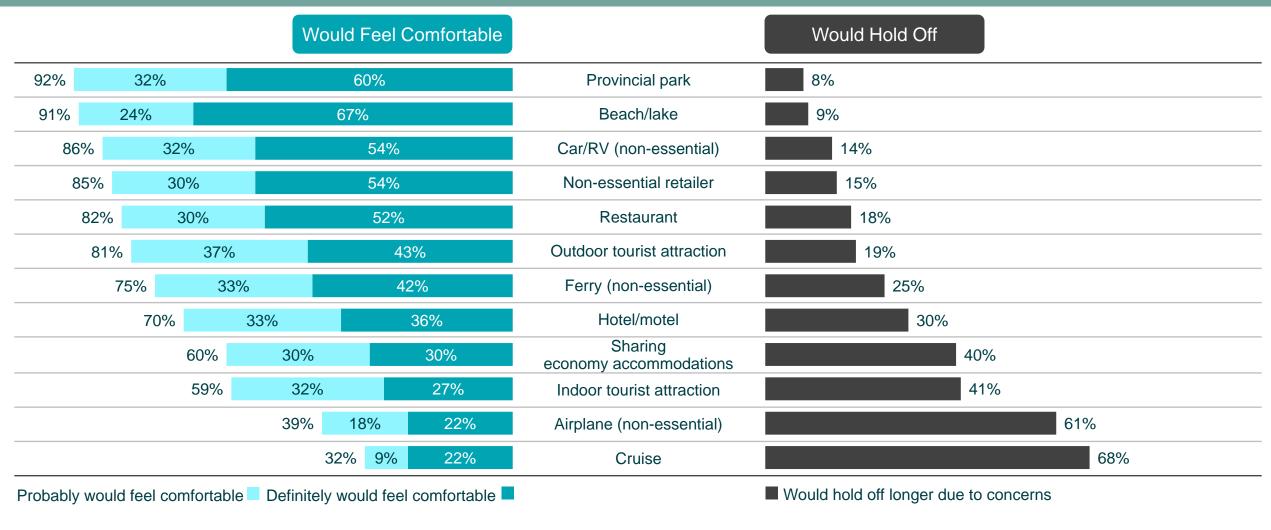

Snapshot Of British Columbians' Comfort Levels With Activities, Transportation and Accommodation



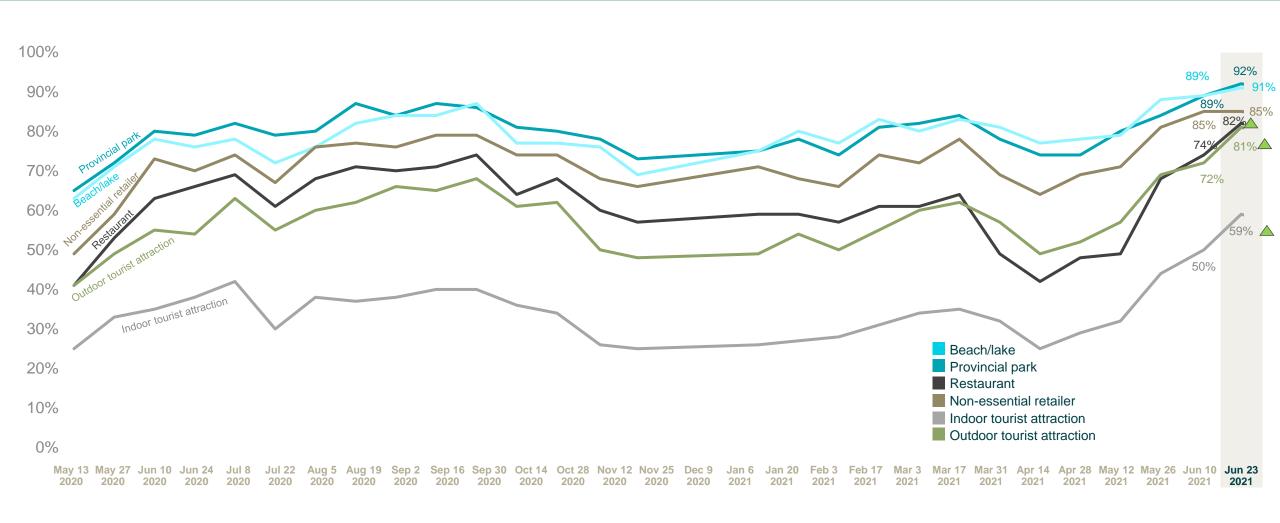

Tracking British Columbians' Comfort Levels With Activities



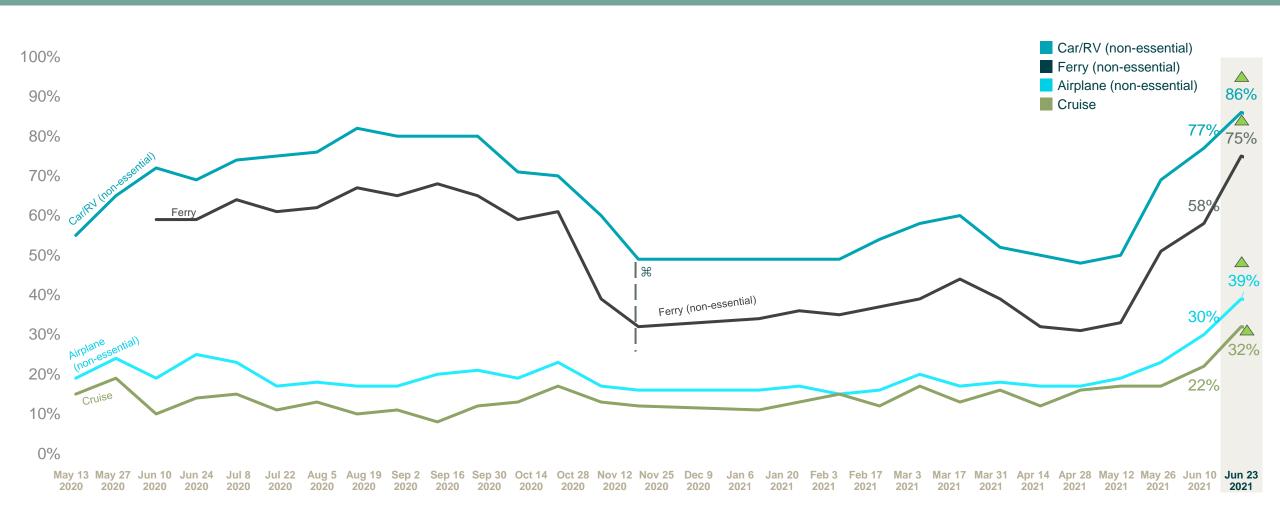
(Total Definitely/Probably Would By Activity)



Tracking British Columbians' Comfort Levels With Transportation Modes



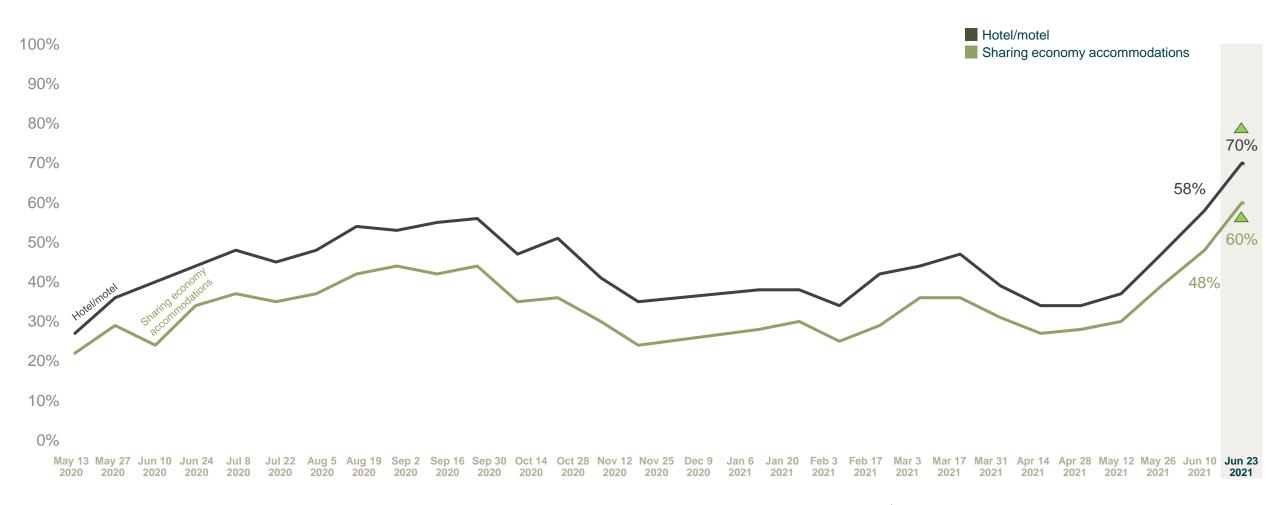

(Total Definitely/Probably Would By Accommodation Type)



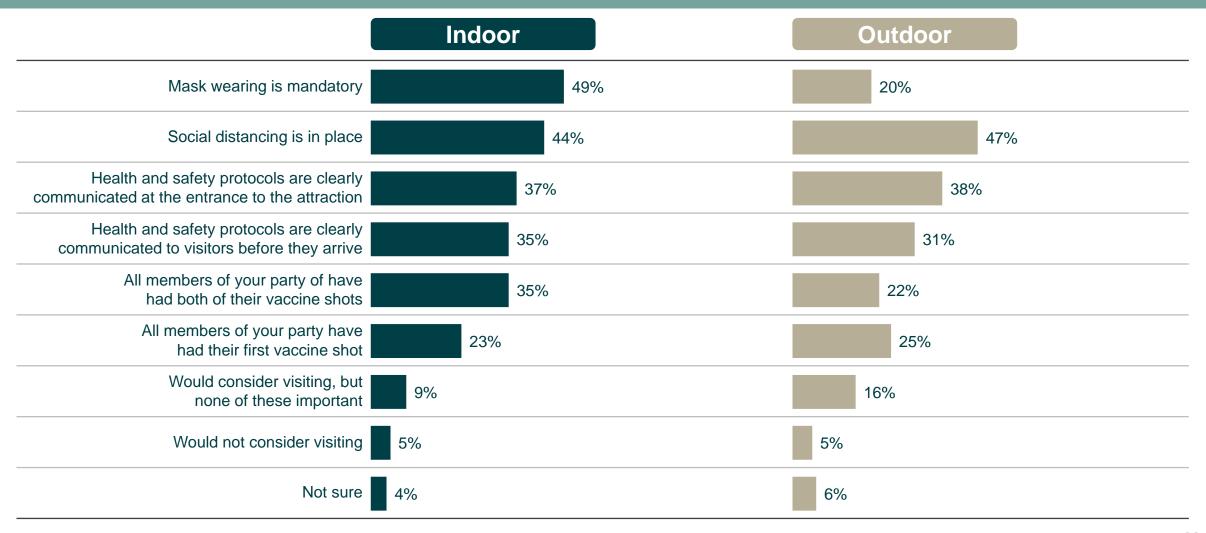

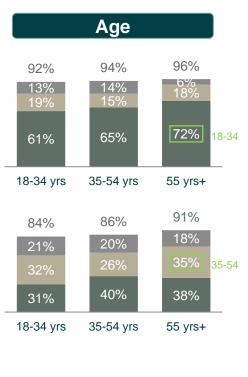

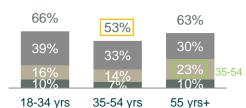

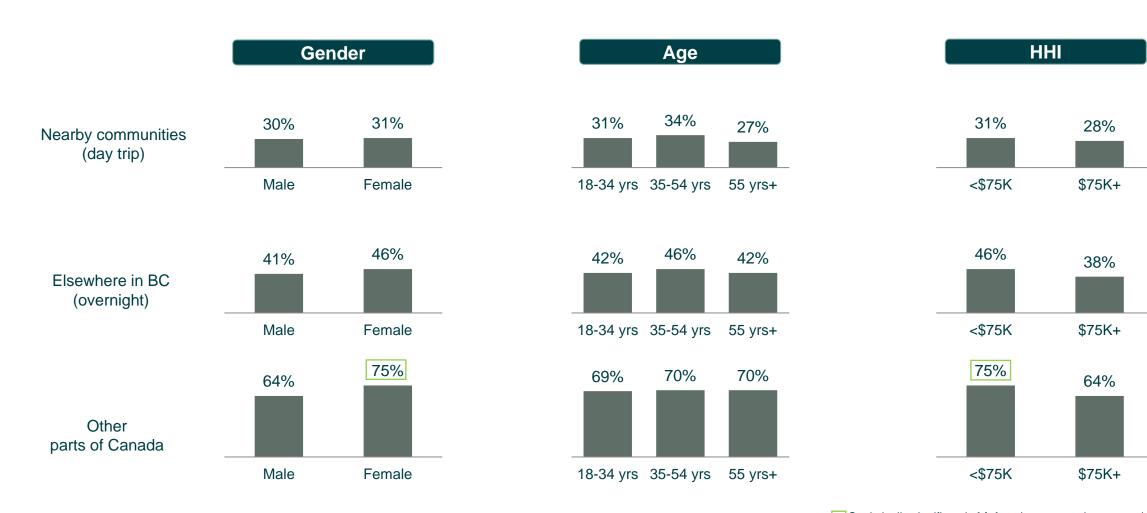

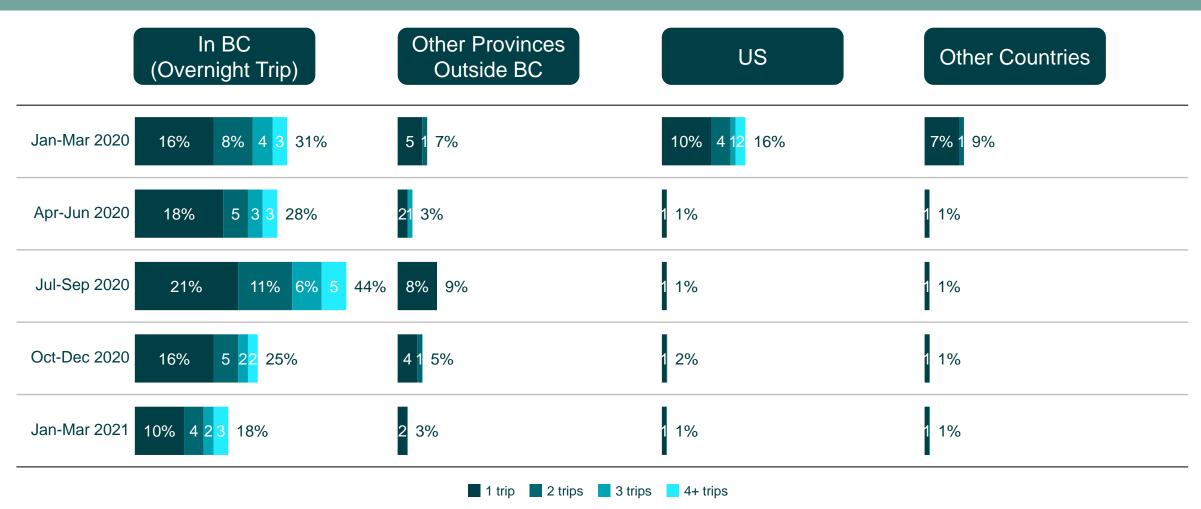

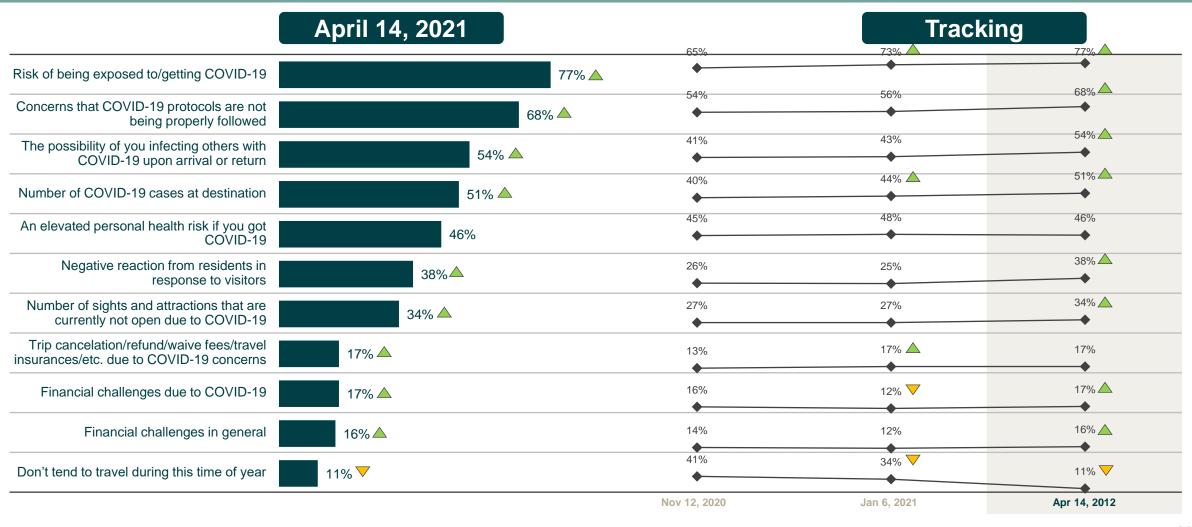

Reasons For Not Considering BC Travel (Aided)

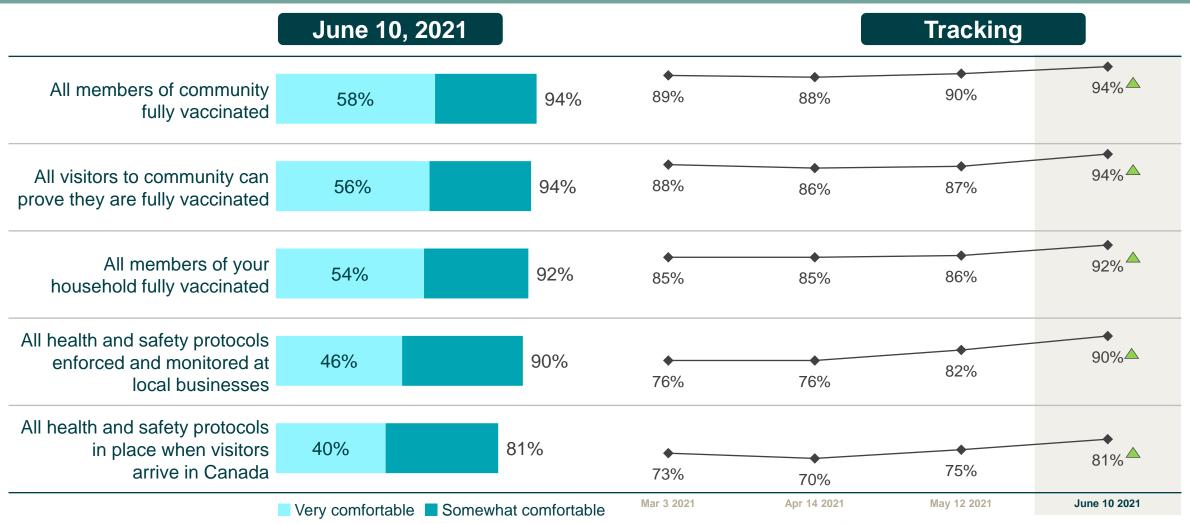


(Among Those Not Intending to Travel in BC in the Next 3 Months)



Comfort With Welcoming Visitors Under Various Circumstances

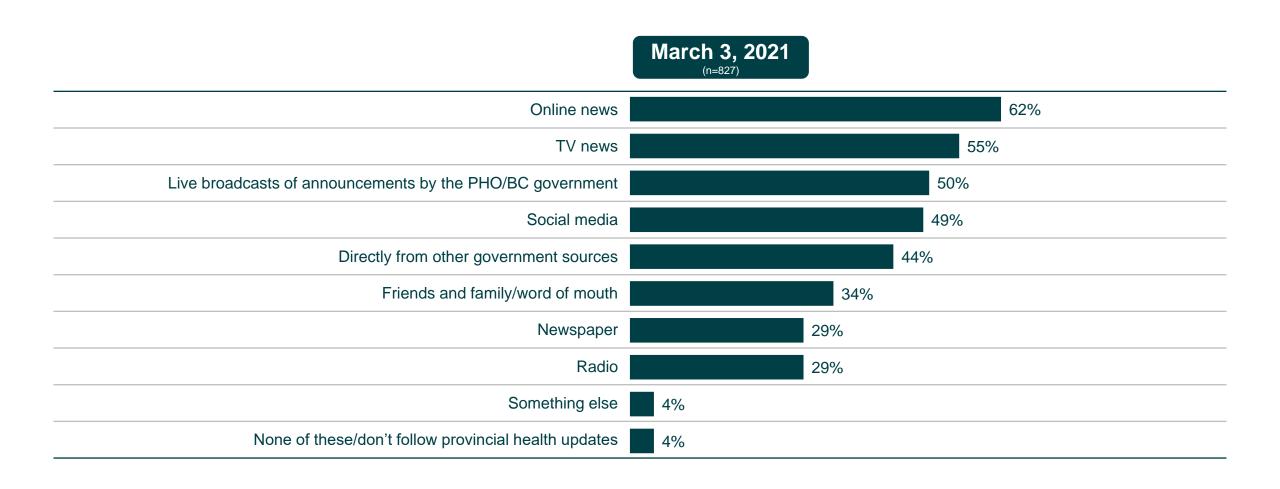
