<u>Disability Alliance BC (DABC) Grants</u>	Supports projects including accessible education and learning, sports and recreation, arts, culture and tourism, community participation, emergency planning and response and accessible employment	Disability Alliance BC	Non-profits
<u>Job Creation Partnerships/Community & Employer Partnerships (JCP/CEP)</u>	Supports funding to organizations and provides community benefits while creating jobs to assist eligible people, including those with disabilities.	BC Provincial Government	Non-profits, Indigenous communities, local governments
<u>BC Employer Training Grant</u>	Provides refundable income tax credits to businesses that employ apprentices, including people with disabilities, who are enrolled in apprenticeship programs administered through the <u>Industry Training Authority</u> .	BC Provincial Government	Non-profits, Indigenous communities, local governments
<u>Enabling Accessibility Fund</u>	Provides funding for eligible capital projects that increase accessibility for people with disabilities in Canadian communities and workplaces. Supports creation of opportunities for people with disabilities to participate in community activities, programs and services, or access employment opportunities.	Government of Canada	Private operators, non-profits, Indigenous communities, local governments
<u>Community Outdoor Revitalization Grants</u>	Capital Grants program: supports Basin communities to create, restore or enhance welcoming, safe and inclusive outdoor multi-use spaces that support community gathering and programming. Project Planning & Design Grants program: available to municipalities with populations of 5,000 or less, unincorporated areas and First Nations communities to plan and design inclusive spaces in rural contexts. <u>Community Gaming Grants</u>	Allow eligible, non-profit organizations to apply for gambling revenues to support a broad range of community programming.	BC Provincial Government	Non-profits, Indigenous communities, local governments
<u>BC Rehab Foundation</u>	Project grants support initiatives designed to benefit people with disabilities	BC Rehab	Charities, non-profits
<u>Capital Project Grants</u>	Provides \$5 million annually to not-for-profit organizations throughout B.C. to support the completion of inclusive, accessible capital projects that meet community-identified needs and priorities.	BC Provincial Government	Not-for-profits
<u>Workplace Accessibility Grant</u>	Provides support to small business employers in BC by providing financial assistance towards creating an inclusive work environment for persons with disability(ies)	Small Business BC	BC based businesses with between 1 and 50 employees
<u>Research & Innovation</u>	Provides funding to community organizations and partners to explore, test and/or find new and innovative ways of delivering programming to help individuals keep, find or return to work through research or the development and implementation of time-limited pilot projects.	BC Provincial Government	Businesses, non-profits, Crown corporations, municipalities or agencies, Band/Tribal Councils/First Nations Governments, public health or educational Institutions
<u>The BC Sport Participation Program (BCSPP) Provincial Sport Development Fund.</u>	Supports programs that attract children, youth, Indigenous and under-represented populations to lead active and healthy lifestyles through involvement in sport while also helping to support communities delivering physical activity programming throughout the province.	Canada & BC Provincial Government via Sport BC	Non-profits serving underrepresented populations including people with disabilities and Indigenous persons
